All year-end audit adjustments have not been made in these summarized statements. To the best of my knowledge, the financial statements fairly present the financial position and the results of operations for Faithful Central Bible Church and Champions for Progress, Inc.” -Pastor Steven Johnson

Revenues and Expenses

Donation income of \$11,541,350 was \$929,362 above budget and \$92,284 more than 2016.

Total income was \$11,962,247 which is \$1,011,885 more than budget and \$17,446 less than 2016.

Expenses, before depreciation, totaled \$11,302,661. The major expense categories include \$3,277,929 for ministry; \$3,010,354 for discipleship, missions and outreach and \$4,593,877 for business & support services. Interest totaled \$420,501. The net income, before depreciation, was \$659,585. Net income, after depreciation and the MTA tunnel was \$611,354.

A. Financial Position/Balance Sheet

1. What we own

Assets: Bank accounts totaled \$1,062,377 at December 31, 2016; \$880,426 of which was restricted. Property, plant and equipment, after accumulated depreciation, were \$14,395,555. Building improvement and equipment additions during 2016 totaled \$1,970,705, including the MTA Pedestrian tunnel construction in progress.

2. What we owe

Liabilities: Accounts payable and accrued expenses for the church were \$592,892; The primary liabilities are the Wells Fargo note payable and capital leases totaling \$8,413,266. Debt was increased \$683,124 through financing of asset purchases and debt refinance.

3. What we have if we pay off what we owe

Fund Balances: The Church holds restricted funds of \$97,936 for missions and other projects. Unrestricted funds (net assets) were \$6,564,428.

By Common Consent the Report was approved

II. 2017 Operating Budget

The 2017 budget anticipates reduction in revenue of \$497,584 compared to 2016 results to \$11,464,663. The use of a regression model predicts stable donation revenue however extraordinary 2016 gifts were not planned for in the budget. Expenses, before depreciation, are budgeted at \$10,212,082. The budgeted net income for 2017 is proposed at \$350,181.

III. 2017 Capital Budget

Capital improvements of \$552,880 are planned and will be funded by operating cash flow and cash reserves.

Bishop Kenneth Ulmer

Greeted everyone and motion was given and accepted to approve to accept the report as given.

Cedric Penix gave overview of leadership and election of officers occurred.

Election of Officers

Elders, Deacons and Deaconess were called to stand and roll call was given. Motion to accept the 2017 slate of officers as presented was made and seconded. Motion was passed.

Bishop Ulmer shared the proposed expansion of the front of the Tabernacle. He also shared the KKL Radio broadcast will be discontinued. He thanked the congregation for their financial support and closed the meeting in prayer.
